The Arizona Leadership Foundation is able to offer scholarships through Arizona’s Corporate Income Tuition Tax Credit (CTC) Scholarship Program and the Disabled/Displaced Corporate Income Tax Credit Program. These Arizona programs are education plans designed to help low-income families and families with disabled/displaced children obtain the best education for their children. Parents can use these scholarships to send their child to a private school of their choice which provides the learning environment best suited to the child.



## WHAT ARE THE LOW-INCOME SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA?

### [1] Family must meet Income Requirement:

#### 2026-27 School Year Criteria

### [2] Student Eligibility Criteria (must meet 1)

- Attended an Arizona public school as a full-time student for at least 90 days of the prior fiscal year or one full semester and then transferred from the public school to a private school; Those students who transfer to a qualified school after the first full semester are eligible to receive a scholarship that same academic year.
- Is enrolling in a private school kindergarten. The student must be 5 years old as of September 1st.
- Is enrolling in a private preschool program for students with disabilities; Student must have an IEP or MET issued by an Arizona public school.
- Is a dependent of a member of the armed forces of the United States who is stationed in Arizona pursuant to military orders.
- Received a low-income corporate scholarship under one of the above criteria in a prior year and the child continued to attend a private school in subsequent years; OR Received an original individual scholarship or a switcher individual scholarship in a prior year and the child continued to attend a private school in subsequent years.
- Student was homeschooled in a prior school year and then directly enrolled in a qualified private school. The student is also eligible if the transition occurs within the same academic year, as long as the transition is from homeschooling directly to the qualified private school.
- Student moved to Arizona from out of state, or internationally, and enrolled directly in a qualified private school.
- Student participated in the Empowerment Scholarship Account (ESA) program and did not renew the account or accept the scholarship, in order to accept an STO scholarship. Participated means the student received ESA funds from the ESA program.

## WHAT ARE THE DISABLED/DISPLACED SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA?

- Student has an IEP, MET or ISP from an Arizona public school (for preschool and grades K-12); OR
- Student has a 504 plan from an Arizona public school (for grades K-12 only); OR
- Student was placed at one time in the Arizona foster care system (for grades K-12 only and to be verified by the Arizona Department of Child Safety (DCS))



A School Tuition Organization cannot award, restrict or reserve scholarships solely on the basis of a donor’s recommendation.  
A taxpayer may not claim a tax credit if the taxpayer agrees to swap donations with another taxpayer to benefit either taxpayer’s own dependent.
